Dogs and cats end up in the shelter for many reasons: with medical issues, suffering from the aftermath of abuse and neglect, with behavioral issues but for the most part they are just simply not wanted in this world. All of them will wait patiently for their turn for a family and forever home. Unfortunately for 50% of the dogs and cats it will never happen.

We would like to tell you about the Humane Society's special needs dogs and cats pictures on the front and to the side. "Marvel" and "Georgia" have broken legs, they are both young and rambunctious and steadily on their way to healing. "Browser" is a senior dog who is diabetic and requires insulin shots twice a day. Mamma Dog "Mystery" came into the shelter very pregnant and delivered nine babies. Mamma Kitty "Lyric" and her babies also made it to safety at the shelter. "Spinner" came from a puppy mill situation where he was kept in a cage most of his young life where he survived by pacing in small circles and although he is improving he still has the need to circle. "Forest" has a heart murmur and in need of understanding and patience as he must learn to trust and to gain confidence. "Tiger Lily" has Cerebellar Hyperplasia a condition she was either born with or was caused by an injury when she was a baby. She will live a normal life with a normal lifespan with no complications and the only thing different is she is wobbly and uncoordinated when she walks. "Ava" is a very lucky girl who came into the shelter after having her throat cut. What the intention of the perpetrator was we will never know. Ava is safe in foster care and eagerly waiting for her special family. Little Puppy "Magic" is the third dog that recently came to the shelter with broken bones. This little guy has both a broken front and back leg and the front leg break will need an orthopedic specialist which usually cost thousands of dollars. We have not figured out how this is going to happen but we just know we are his only hope.

With your support the Humane Society can continue to provide the necessary medical treatments and medical supplies, long term care, emergency care and vital spay and neuter surgeries to these and other animals. Thank you for caring.
