The Struggles and the Challenges of the Humane Society

The struggles and the challenges of rescuing animals are understood but the financial cost to do so is often unclear. Below is a monthly account of the shelter's operating costs. These figures do not include the dog and cat food, cleaning supplies and miscellaneous items because we are fortunate to have these essentials donated regularly. It also does not include shelter repairs, upkeep and emergency medical veterinarian care. We have five employees that earn minimum wage, a volunteer maintenance man, a volunteer grounds keeper and a volunteer Board of Directors.
